The Humble Petition of John
Badcock of No 4 Meads Court
Wardour Street in the County of
Middlesex

Sheweth,

That your petitioner is the Father of
one Edward Badcock the subject
of this Petition

That in the month of July last
the said Edward Badcock was
tried before Mr J^r Adams at the
Clerkenwell Sessions for having —
unlawful possession of a Pocket
Handkerchief and he was convicted
sentenced for that offence by the said
learned Judge to 10 years Transportation.

That the said Edward Badcock
is now of the age of 13 years only
and is the eldest Son of a family of

Nine Children of whom your Petitioner is the Father.

That your Petitioner has been in much better circumstances than he is in at present by having been in business for himself as a Hatter for a great number of years, but owing to many domestic afflictions and the reverse of fortune he has been greatly reduced

That your Petitioners wife has lost her reason and is now confined in Bedlam and in which Institution she has been for the last 12 months.

That the said Edward Badcock your Petitioners said Son has unfortunately been made the dupe of wicked accomplices with whom he has latterly got intermixed and in this case the more innocent is suffering for the more guilty.

That the said Edward Badcock previously to his having become acquainted with those persons used to be industriously employed, and helped in a measure to tend towards the support of the large Family your Petitioner is the father of

That your Petitioner being in very needy circumstances owing to the scarcity of employment in his trade of a Hatter and the poorness of the remuneration when there happens to be employment feels greatly the loss of his said Son not only on account of the weekly stipend which he used previously to his confinement to earn but also from the fact of your petitioner supposing that a child of your petitioner should be doomed to

undergo the sentence which has been passed upon him thro' the wicked designs of others.

That your Petitioners would willingly place him under his immediate control if an opportunity offered and endeavour to restore him once again to the paths of virtue and prudence in order to make him a useful member of society.

Your Petitioners therefore most humbly pray that your Lordship may be pleased to grant a commutation of the sentence passed on the said Edward Badcock to be made and that instead of a somewhat innocent Child being made the sufferer ^{for others} of whose guilt is of a deeper dye, by undergoing the long term of imprisonment allotted to him he may thro' the instrumentality of your Lordship be restored to the bosom of his Family after undergoing a term of imprisonment which in your Lordships discretion may think advisable to answer the ends of justice and at the same time prove a lesson to him as to his future conduct thro' life.
